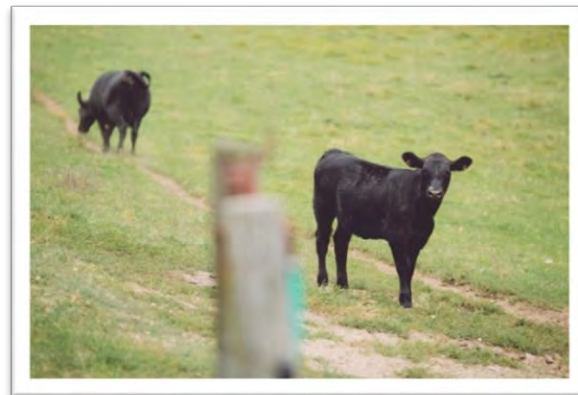
To get to the castle ruins, you and your guests will be shuttled in SUVs directly through the cow pasture of Gibbet Hill.

All of your décor is transported and set up by Gibbet Hill staff.

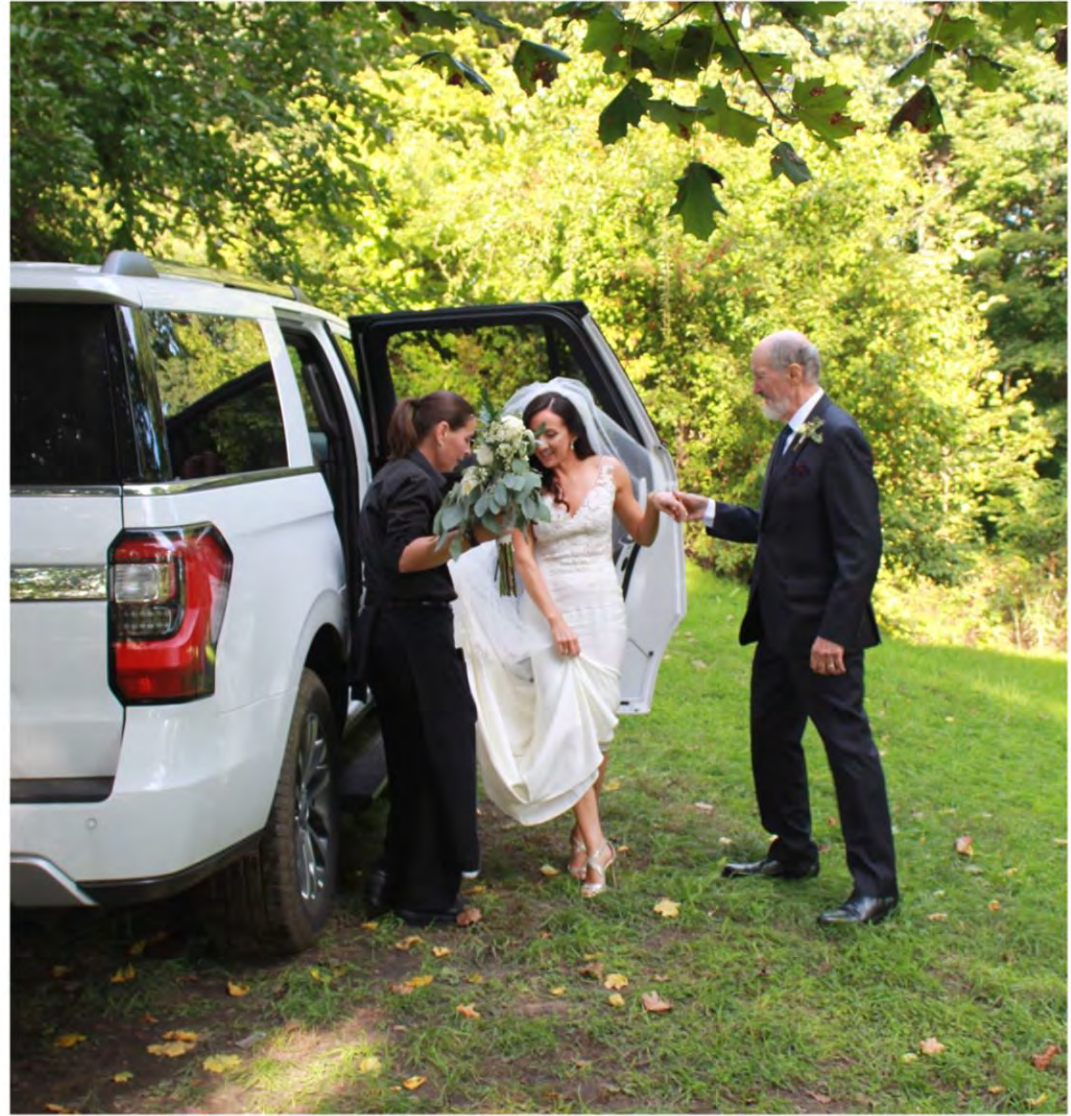




A second level with added seating overlooks the ceremony.

Wedding Ceremonies Held at Historical Castle Ruins

For couples whose weddings fall between mid-June and early October, we offer the option of having your ceremony at the top of Gibbet Hill.

This is an exclusive ceremony location, limited to 4 per year.

Your guests will be driven to the top of the hill in SUVs and your ceremony will be set in the ivy-covered ruins of Bancroft's castle.

Grassy fields overlooking the town and beyond are available for your photographs and guests' exploration.

Receptions take place over five and one half consecutive hours.

Receptions must end no later than 1:00a.

Overtime available at \$250 for 30 minutes, \$500 for 60 minutes.

Menu Pricing and Products are Subject to Change.

Minimum Menu Price: \$94 for all dates, except Monday - Thursday

*Monday – Thursday 20% Off the Menu Price. Minimum Menu Price is \$75 after 20% discount.

Fees: 11% gratuity and 9% administration fee is applied to all food & beverage.

Tax: 6.25% state tax and 0.75% local tax will be added to your total bill, excluding gratuity.

Note: Weddings with 200 or more guests incur an additional \$1,000 fee for one additional SUV and driver.
